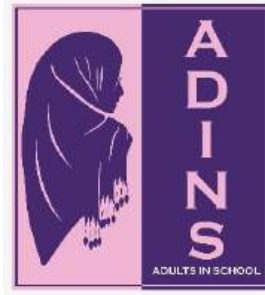

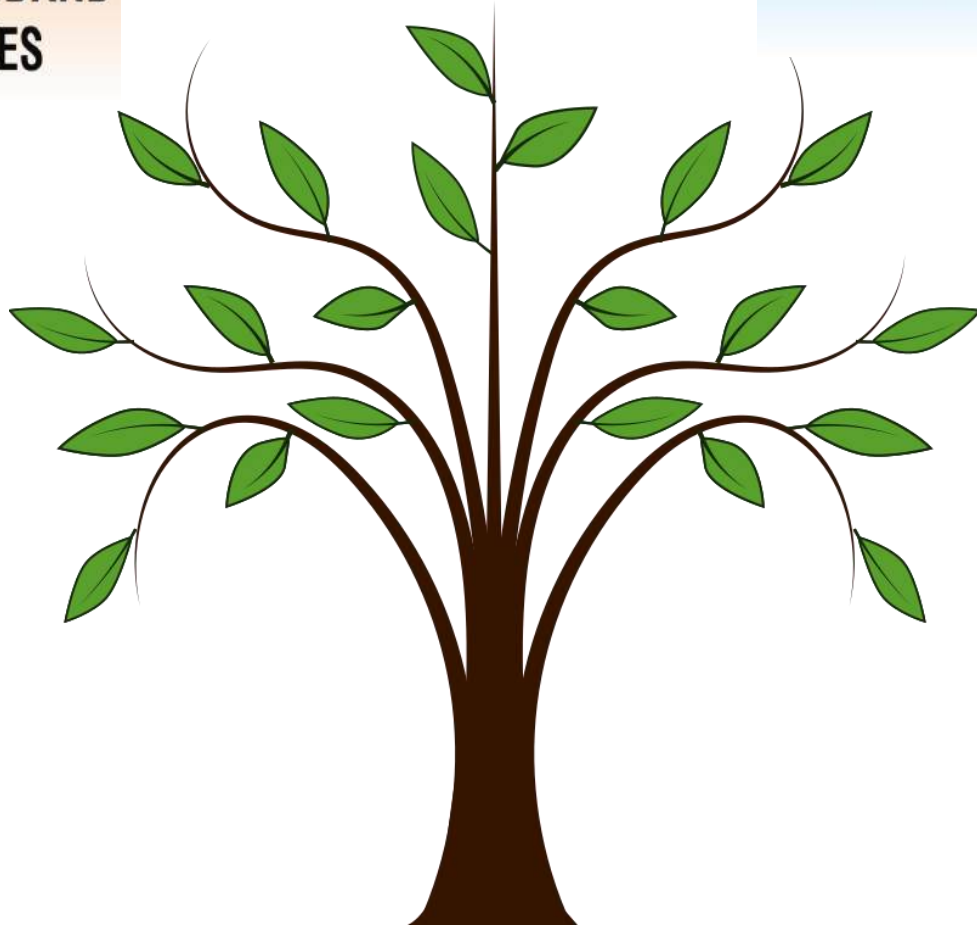

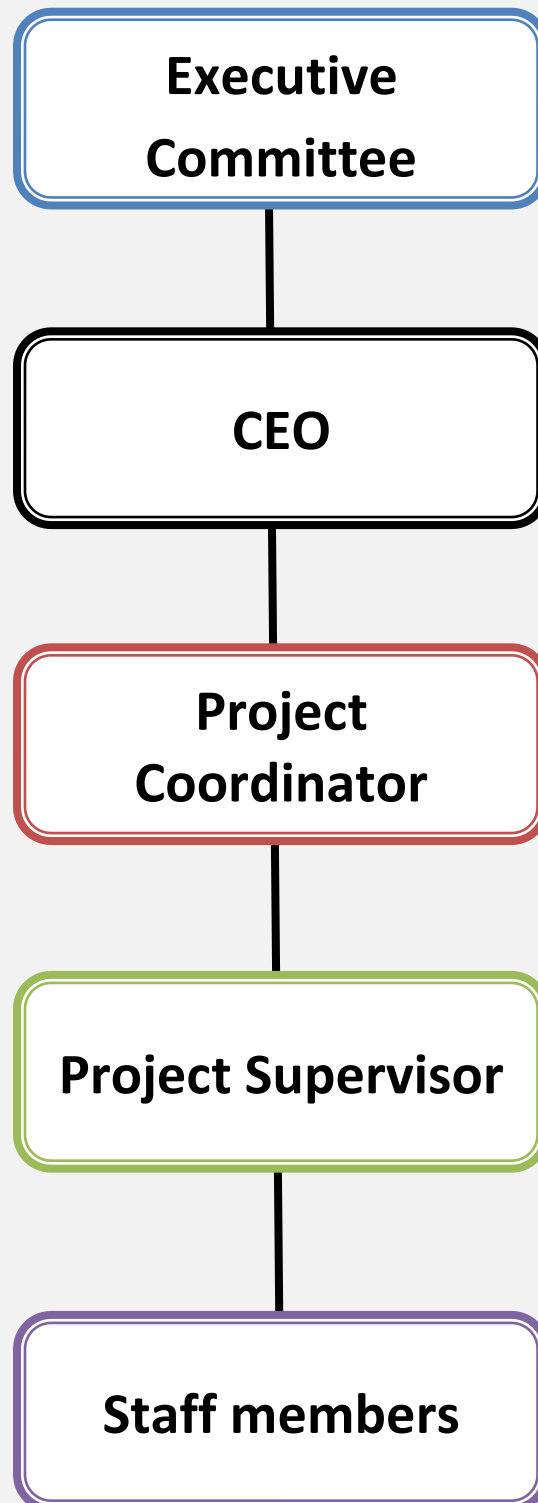

PROJECT DETAILS

Street To School (STS) is a pioneer program of Open For Everyone (O4E) Welfare Organization. STS is an opportunity for the street children to have a brighter future. It focuses on the children who plays idly on the streets whole day after their parents went off to work. These children are vulnerable to a number of diseases as well as societal ills. STS is striving to provide them quality pre-school education so that they can be enrolled into a school to join the formal education system. Currently, STS have fully functional A Baby's Club (ABC), Montessori and Kindergarten sections with around 30 students each. We also have a "Basic Primary Class (BPC)" for children who have crossed the age of school but have not been enrolled in a school before. Here we make them able to join their age group in a formal school.



Adults in School (ADINS) caters people who have crossed the schooling age but have not been fortunate enough to attend a school. We observed that the parents of our students at STS are living in destitute condition. They also wanted to educate their children but lack of required resources discourages them. We appreciated their willingness to learn and provided them the opportunity to improve their standard of living.

In May 2015, we launched our ADINS project. We started with women because when you educate a woman, you educate a generation. It was challenging to encourage females to come out of their houses for something the male members of their family would not favor. We had to conduct a series of public meetings to encourage them for their children education in order to make this project successful.



Later on, we also started separate classes for men. It proved much fruitful result for the skilled labor like Electricians and Plumbers who were previously facing great difficulties in managing financial matters. ADINS focuses on three aspects of life. Basic education is the foremost one. We teach them what they have missed in past, these three aspects entail; Reading, Writing and Arithmetic math. We teach both English and Urdu languages along with the arithmetic math.

Next step is to make them able to have a sustainable livelihood. We have conducted regular sessions on entrepreneurship. Our trainers guided them that how can they establish their own small businesses and earn profit from them. We not only guide them but also provide them financial assistance under our project "Street Deeds". Under this project, we have helped two of our students to setup general stores and a female student to buy a sewing machine to generate income from home.

Third step is parenting. The way they would raise their children would have lasting impact on generations to come. We have regular classes on parenting skills. We guide them in building healthy parent-children relationships. Our trainers teach them to fulfill their children's physical, emotional, social, financial, and intellectual needs better. We occasionally have class discussions to learn about the problems they are facing regarding their children and subsequent counseling sessions to resolve them. These sessions are helpful in reducing the population of street children in the area.

Street deeds provide financial assistance to the needy people. Our funds for street deeds are collected through Zakat and Donations. Sometimes we also work as an intermediary between the donor and the receiver by arranging a sponsor for a particular case. Anyone can apply for our assistance. Every application has been given a fair chance of review. We allocate our funds for street deeds into three different categories.



Income Generation:

It focuses on shifting people from the unemployed bracket to the self-employed bracket. Income generation receives 50 percent of our Street Deeds funds. All financial assistance is provided on an interest free loan basis which will be returned in the form of monthly installments. However in Zakat case it is not applicable. We have helped a number of families to establish a continuous income generation stream. This initiative enabled them to escape the ills of adversity.

Healthcare

It focuses on helping people who encounter a medical situation and could not afford to get it treated. Healthcare receives 30 percent of our Street Deeds funds. We have helped a number of people to avail medical facilities who were injured in traffic accidents or suffering from disparate diseases.

Others

It covers everything except income generation and healthcare. It receives the remaining 20 percent allocation of our Street Deeds funds.

What happens when you see heaps of garbage littering the streets everywhere in Karachi? Does your heart bleed looking at the eyesores? Do you feel like doing something that can clean all the garbage you see on streets, alleys, and in fact, all across your city? Unfortunately, in a city like Karachi, heaps of garbage found on corners of the streets not only reflects the inefficiency of the city government but, also represents an insensitive attitude of our people towards a problem. All over the world, the process of recycling has been adopted as a means of minimizing this environmental degradation.



Based on the study conducted by the Pakistan Environmental Protection Agency (PEPA); Pakistan generates over 20 million tons of solid waste annually, almost 47,000 tons of solid wastes per day. Karachi being the industrial hub of the country generates about 10,700 tons of solid waste. Due to lack of proper waste-collection sites and inadequate trash bins, most of the waste finds its way into dumping grounds, open pits, river, ponds and agricultural fields, leading to the excessive burning of waste on street corners everywhere, while posing serious risk to Public health.

We would like to contribute our role in national development via creating opportunities for underprivileged through reducing waste disposal and using it for income generation.

Rangeen Project working areas entail:

- Recycling of garbage.
- Make useful materials from scarp and sell it into potential markets.
- Provide entrepreneurship trainings to communities.

We have started in-house school lunch facility to maintain nutritional values of kids. So they can grow and nourish better.



DROP IN CENTER

GHARIBABAD

Gharibabad Drop-in centre is our first drop-in centre situated in Gharibabad, District Central, Karachi. Gharibabad (Poor's settlement) constitutes a densely populated, multicultural, multilingual, and Muslim neighborhood. People from different regions in the country have settled here. Major ethnic groups are Urdu, Punjabi, Sindhi and Saraiki. Majority of the population is living below the poverty line in this area. They work on daily wages; their occupations include car painting, car repairing, welding, carpentry, shepherds, goatherds, milkmen and the a likes. Youth either spends whole day playing Snooker, Carom and Cards for gambling or stay unconscious by taking drugs. Infants play outside their homes on streets and in trash dumps. Rate of early marriages, number of children per woman and divorces are all quite exorbitant in this area. Illiteracy and ignorance is destroying generations after generations in this area. All such factors encouraged our CEO Mr. Muhammad Hassan Ghoghari to come up with an idea of O4E. Setting our first drop-in centre in such a locality was a difficult task. We did it because this was the place that needed this facility most. Today, we are running our all five projects in Gharibabad and garnered a positive response from the public.
